

Chamber of Commerce Meeting Notes  
October 11, 2017

Number of people in attendance: 12

Meeting called to order at 12:15

- Sharon made a motion to accept the meeting minutes for 9/25 and 10/3. Jonne made a motion to second. All present members were in favor.
- The results of Hog Wild were discussed – overall, it was successful. After bills, the total profit made was \$2,025.65. Sharon made a motion to pay the bills for Hog Wild. Scotty made a motion to second. All present members were in favor.
- The treasurers report was handed out. Jack made a motion to accept the report and Bobbie motioned to second. All present members were in favor.
- It was reported that the haunted house is progressing well so far – it is now covered with plastic and just needs to have the inside walls finished.
- Recommended by-laws changes were sent out and the response was positive. Nomination forms will be sent out electronically. Nominations may be made electronically until October 23<sup>rd</sup>. Online nominations will be announced at the chamber meeting on October 24<sup>th</sup> and an opportunity will be given to make additional nominations. After, ballots will be dispersed electronically and will need to be received by November 6<sup>th</sup>. On November 7<sup>th</sup>, an opportunity will be given during chamber to vote in-person.
- Cynda Herrick, Planning and Zoning Administrator, gave a talk on the progress of Pathways and various projects. The Valley County plan was updated by the Commissioners last year. The Cascade Mobility Team has been working to make Cascade a tourism destination. There are currently ten different water trails in Cascade. A story map that includes all ten trails can be found on the West Central Mountains website as well as the Valley County website. Moving forward, Pathways will continue finding ways to create trails that link the McCall, Donnelly, and Cascade communities. This may be done by creating trail-oriented open space, similar to the Boise foothills, or by creating a Northern Valley County Recreation District which could obtain easements. At this time, trails are still not available through the Pine Lakes Ranch area.
- Updates were given on Old Mill Days – the festivities at the fairgrounds were filmed for marketing use. The log roll competition at the Rec. Center was successful and had a good turn out.
- The Rec. Center is hosting a “Kid’s Night Out” on November 20<sup>th</sup>. The event will take place from 4 pm until 9 pm – kids will swim for two hours, be fed dinner, and then play games and watch movies. The price is \$20 for one child or \$20 for the first sibling and \$10 for each additional child. Scholarships are available.
- Chamber is currently looking for volunteers to run the Spookhouse October 27<sup>th</sup> through October 31<sup>st</sup> from 6:30 to 10 pm. Cost for individuals will be \$6 per person or \$5 with a can of food.
